

The environment for speech development in the family and its importance

Perform tongue and lip exercises based on the recommendation of a speech therapist. Instead of criticizing the child, it is necessary to use the method of encouragement. The speech environment in the family is an important factor in the speech, thinking and personal development of the child. Creating a rich, active and positive communicative environment from an early age is an effective tool in preventing speech disorders. Therefore, increasing the pedagogical literacy of parents and developing family speech culture are one of the priority tasks of the modern education system.
